#### **Parish Council News**

We have held two Parish Council meetings since the last Messenger. Both had the usual agenda items and were well attended by our Councillors. We also welcomed Louise Wainwright to our June meeting – she is our newly elected County Councillor and is hoping to attend our meetings regularly as do our District Councillors Mark Long and Samantha Dennis. Their reports and input are very helpful at all times.

Louise is working hard to sort road problems around her area. Reporting potholes online does work and we ask if you do this to please let our Parish Clerk know too so we can monitor the result and keep Louise informed. We have already told her that we feel that many of the minor road problems are the worn away edges and potholes at the end of passing places. Larger farm vehicles, delivery vans and other large vehicles like caravans and camper vans don't help this!

At our last meeting a parishioner raised the continuing danger of speeding cars on the main road through the village – walking along the roadway between the homes and Asda is hair-raising as we all agreed. We were informed some months ago that there were plans to move the bus stop, and we will be trying to get more information on this as waiting passengers add to the problem too. Initially we will be passing the speed data from the VAS sign to the police and asking them to conduct a traffic survey.

Over the last few weeks we have already approached some homeowners to ask them to trim their roadside hedges and trees as it has been a very good growing year as all gardeners will know. There are many other homes in the parish where the hedges and trees are stretching over or into the pavements and roads. Please walk around your boundary and trim them if you find a problem. Brambles seem to grow overnight!

Our facilities are well used at all times. We hope to spruce up the bus shelter at Townsend Cross in the autumn and now have regular cleaning organised. This also goes for the public toilets, where like the bus shelter there is a bin just outside but users still leave cigarette ends, sweet papers, coffee cups and so on lying around. Many thanks to those who do litter pick around and tidy the weeds around the homes as it does make a difference to the general appearance of our area.

We have no meeting in August, but Bex our new Parish Clerk will be monitoring her phone and email on a regular basis during the holiday period, so do leave a message if you have a problem that we can deal with and remember that many things can be reported on the SHDC or DCC websites – see the back page of this Messenger for more information.

Our next meeting will be on Wednesday 17th September at 19:00 in the Village Hall Annexe. If you wish to raise a concern in Open Forum it is helpful if you let our Parish Clerk know in advance. Nowadays the reports and so on are sent out to Councillors in advance so we try to make sure that meetings are less than 2 hours in length.

#### Cold Callers - Seasonal Update

Intelligence suggests cold callers may be operating in Kingsbridge, Salcombe and surrounding areas, offering roof maintenance and other house or garden maintenance.

- Don't agree to work offered by unsolicited doorstep callers.
- Don't rely on posts or recommendations on social media sites or trader approval platforms without doing your own research.
- Don't be swayed by glossy flyers or impressive websites as they may not show the trader's own work.
- Don't pay cash or agree to be taken to the bank or immediately transfer money before any work is started.
- · Don't be rushed into making a decision.

If you want work doing in your home or garden, make sure you:

- Get three written quotes from reputable businesses.
- Research the companies e.g. ask for references and look online. Ask friends and family to recommend local traders or search via Buy With Confidence: www. buywithconfidence.gov.uk/
- Decide who to use in your own time and make sure you have confidence in their skills and abilities.

Make sure you have the full name of the company and the person doing the work and their contact details (address, phone number, email). Check ID if genuine appointments have been made.

Ask to see professional qualifications, public liability insurance and if applicable waste carriers licence. To check the service you use has a Waste Carriers Licence, go to: environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/ search-waste-carriers-brokers

Unlicensed carriers will often fly-tip your waste at roadsides and beauty spots.

You could face an unlimited fine if your waste ends up flytipped and you cannot show that you took reasonable steps to prevent it. Always ask exactly what is going to happen to your waste and seek evidence that it is going to be disposed of appropriately. A legitimate, professional waste carrier should not object to being asked reasonable questions. Get a proper invoice and receipt for your waste and retain this as proof.

Check if you're entitled to your 14-day cooling-off period – see this guide: bit.ly/3IWu3YD

Ask if the company has an Alternative Dispute Resolution policy – is there any independent body to complain to if things go wrong? Pay by bank transfer so the payment is traceable. If you can, use a credit card for payments between £100 and £30,000 because if you have a claim for breach of contract or misrepresentation against the supplier of the goods or services, Section 75 gives you the same claim against your credit card company. If you are concerned rogue traders are operating in your area, always report it to Citizens Advice: www.citizensadvice. org.uk/consumer/get-more-help/if-you-need-more-help-about-a-consumer-issue/

If you are concerned someone is at risk, always call the police. If someone knocks on your door and you're not sure, don't open the door. Find more information here: www.devonsomersettradingstandards.gov.uk/consumer/scams-rogue-traders-and-doorstep-crime/

#### Citizens Advice

As a community charity, we rely on our volunteers to help with a variety of tasks, including frontline advice, reception, trustees, research, campaigning and administrative tasks.

No previous experience is necessary as we provide all the training and support you need for your chosen role. You always work as part of a wider team under the guidance of our local experts.

Tilly, one of our volunteers, said:

"Before I started at Citizens Advice South Hams, I knew very little about the difficult circumstances people sometimes find themselves in and how hard it can be for them to find a way forward.

"Helping someone get on top of their problems is sometimes challenging but hugely rewarding and it's great being part of a team all pulling in the same direction to achieve the same goals."


The commitment for volunteering is around six hours-aweek, usually on the same day each week, and all expenses are paid.

#### **The National Trust**

The summer has brought the heat but also some wet, which means the footpaths have been growing quickly. The rangers and volunteers have been working hard to keep them strimmed back and accessible.

We have been harvesting seed from the wildflower meadow that we established at Southdown Farm which will be used around the farm and on other sites in the local area to increase the diversity of the meadows. We have also been working in partnership with SMASH donating seed for the churchyard and other projects they are working on around the village. Increasing the amount of different native flowers attracts more insects, which are important pollinators and a key part of the food chain.

The new footpath we created from East Soar car park to East Soar Outdoor Experience is sadly being spoilt by dog

#### **National Trust South Hams Centre**

I begin with news of a recent additional donation we have made to support the South Devon Coast and Countryside. The South Hams Centre was asked if we could help finance work at South Milton Sands. Area Ranger, Emma, explained that over the past few years they have been working to fence off the whole of the dune system using paling fencing. This has proved effective in keeping visitors and dogs off the dunes, allowing the marram grass to reestablish and thrive, protecting this habitat. They have a further section to fence and were struggling to fund the work. I am pleased to report that our committee agreed a donation of £530 towards this important project.

Our most recent coach trip was to Cornwall, with visits to Kernow Mill and The Duchy of Cornwall Nursery at Lostwithiel. Originally a slate quarry, the nursery began life producing forest trees in the late 1960s. It started to sell plants to the public in 1974 and went on to become one of the largest and most well-respected nurseries in the south west. The Duchy Nursery has grown a great deal since it began over 50 years ago. Today it is a place of sanctuary for every visitor, where horticulture is celebrated, nature is allowed to flourish – and one is tempted to come home with plants in tip-top condition!

On Thursday 21st August we are heading back into Cornwall when we will be going to Tamar View and then to Windmills, near Callington, which the owners describe as a "garden full of surprises!" The last event for this summer, on Friday 19th September, is an outing to east Devon, to Honiton and then to Cadhay Manor at Ottery St Mary, where we will have a guided tour of the splendid mansion, listed by Country Life as one of the top ten manor houses in the country.

Nearer to home, a reminder that Overbeck's Garden is open 10:30 to 16:00 every day throughout August, with guided garden tours available on Wednesday afternoons (booking essential.)

Additionally, there have been ongoing concerns regarding dog fouling on the pitches and surrounding areas. To ensure the health and safety of all users, we request that dogs are not brought onto the playing fields.

It is regrettable that the newly installed bench has already sustained damage and been relocated. While we will address the repairs and reinstallation on this occasion, it is important to understand that, as a charity, our primary income is derived from booking fees, which we strive to keep affordable for all. In response to incidents of this sort, CCTV has been installed and is now operational, with the aim of promoting safety and discouraging further vandalism. Implementing these measures puts significant pressure on our limited budget.

These were all performed with great humour by Peter who ended by inviting us all to join in singing Monty Python's famous "Always Look on the Bright Side of Life." It was a wonderfully entertaining morning.

At the end of July we all met together in Malborough for our monthly meeting. This time our speaker was our old friend Adam Hart-Davis. He told us about some of the mysteries which have puzzled scientists and historians over many years, starting with UFOs and how the term "flying saucer" came to be used.

It was a fascinating and entertaining morning enjoyed by everyone there.


