



#### Kingsbridge Amateur Theatrical Society

Taking a Gander at "Gander:" A What-to-Do Guide if 7,000 'Blow-Ins' Turn Up in Your Small Town Without Warning.

"On the North East tip of North America, on an island called Newfoundland, there's an airport..." So begins 'Come From Away,' the Tony Award-winning musical which is KATS' next production, March 2026.

Researching its setting, we discovered how this remote town of Gander, home to one of the world's largest airports, became the centre of global kindness after 9/11, when 38 planes and 7,000 passengers were diverted there.

The story focuses not on tragedy but on compassion, humour, and community spirit as townspeople fed, clothed, and cared for strangers stranded for five days. It's a heart warming portrayal of humanity – complete with jokes about toilet paper and all.

Like Gander, our parishes share coastal isolation and sudden population surges – though ours come with tourists, not grounded flights. Gander's huge airport existed for strategic wartime refuelling and later welcomed celebrities from the Queen to the Beatles. Its decline with



jumbo jets nearly led to closure—thankfully not before 9/11.

Newfoundlanders' resilience stems from past disasters: plane crashes in 1946, 1967, and 1985 tested their unity and compassion.

Come From Away weaves true stories of friendship, love and loss – Texan and English lovers, two mothers of firefighters, a teacher and an Egyptian chef, a woman rescuing animals, and a rookie reporter narrating it all.

A celebration of kindness amid chaos, Come From Away reminds us that even in darkness, empathy can make a small town shine on the world stage.

#### **Malborough Pre-school**

We've had a fantastic start to the autumn term at preschool, and the children have settled in wonderfully. It has been lovely to see familiar faces returning with confidence and enthusiasm, ready for new experiences.

This term has already brought some exciting changes to our environment. The children have been enjoying our new resources, including the soft and colourful new carpet, the imaginative role-play kitchens, and the comfortable sofas that have quickly become a favourite spot for stories and quiet time.

We were also thrilled to hold a successful Open Day, where families had the chance to explore our setting, meet the staff, and see the activities we offer. It was a warm and welcoming start to the term, and we loved meeting everyone who came along.

Our activities have taken on a seasonal theme. The children have been collecting leaves, noticing the colours and textures, and using them in creative play. We've also been busy making bright and colourful firework pictures, experimenting with different materials to create dazzling effects.

With such a positive start, we're already looking forward to the weeks ahead as we continue our journey towards Christmas, with plenty more seasonal fun and learning still to come.

We are offering 30 hours' funding to working parents for 3 and 4 year olds. This is proving very popular and our

#### **The National Trust**

The winter work is well underway with the lovely traditional task of hedgelaying being carried out by the volunteers and rangers at Snapes Point. This ancient way of managing hedgerows maintains a stock-proof barrier and keeps the hedgerow in good condition for years to come, creating great habitat for wildlife as it regrows with vigorous new shoots which will then be covered in blossom and berries.

The fencing work in also underway in the fields behind Bolberry where we are creating smaller field parcels offering more shelter and shade for livestock. This will also create more habitat for wildlife to nest and feed in the new hedges which will be planted as the divisions for the new parcels. We are also working towards creating a new path through the site to create a circular walking route linking with the SWCP National Trail. Part of the new route will be permissive bridleway meaning it can be used by walkers, cyclists and horseriders.

We will be carrying out our winter scrub management work through the coastal slopes; this is to reduce the cover of vigorous gorse growth, creating a mosaic of scrub and coastal grasslands which provides shelter and nesting areas for wildlife and prevents the gorse from taking over and smothering the flower rich grasslands.

We have carried out more wildflower seed collection from the hay meadow at Southdown Farm. These seeds have been spread on other fields on the farm and at Prawle Point to increase the diversity of flowers in the meadows

and are all native plants adapted to the exposed coastal areas. We have also shared the seed with other community groups to use on their projects.

#### Saint Peters and All Saints Church Bells Update

A huge thank you to everyone who helped with the fundraising, events, donations and support over the last 3 years to repair and maintain the Malborough Church Bells.

Initially we thought we would need to raise £70,000, but on further inspection and with the repair of the Bell Frame in July of this year, the cost has significantly reduced. A further inspection from Taylor Bells, Bellhangers from Loughborough, in September 2025 advised that the work on the frame was very satisfactory and that the extensive work initially quoted was not now needed, hence the reduction in cost, but some work was necessary to repair the treble and 3rd bell wheels, headstocks and gudgeons. The funds raised have enabled the repair of the bell frame and will cover the cost of the work to the bell wheels. gudgeons and bell wheels.

We should see the bells ready to ring again very shortly, possibly before Christmas this year. There is also some money left in the Bell Fund as minor work still needs to be done, but it is not vital for the ringing of the bells. We will continue to raise funds and and keep the monies raised in our Bell Fund, for future maintenance and repair.

Thanks to all your efforts we managed to raise a total of £33,268.97, of which £3,900 has been spent on repairs to the bell frame, which leaves us £29,368.97, some of which will be used for the repairs to the bell wheels, headstocks and gudgeons, with the rest to be kept for future use.

A special thank you to Maggie Berndt for her hard work and tireless effort in the fundraising and to those individuals who donated their time and money generously.

Congratulations to S.M.A.S.H. and to the 12 local volunteers who came and joined in the Marine Conservation Society Great British Beach Clean at Soar Mill Cove on Saturday 27th September.

Big Dave rigged up the breeches buoy which was used to save hundreds of lives between 1900, and 1930. The magnificent Lisa M and Tracy C ran the raffle with gifts donated by many individuals and local businesses including Ashby's, the Beach Shop, the Malborough Codmobile, the Cottage Hotel and the Cove.




