

Sustainable Malborough and South Huish (SMASH)

Here is an update on SMASH activities over the last few months.

Beach cleans: We had 3 events this year. Soar Mill, Hope Cove and a final one in September at Soar Mill Cove. This one was part of the Great British Beach Clean run by the Marine Conservation Society. All 3 were well supported and hundreds of pieces of plastic and other debris were removed from the beaches. A few people on Soar Mill Cove joined in and were very complimentary about our action.

Tree care in the Malborough Wood: We had a couple of mornings checking on the 'whips' that were planted over the last couple of years. This involved clearing the weeds around the base and taking off any guards. They were mostly in good shape and growing away nicely. We will be pruning some of the apple trees in the winter to keep them producing their lovely fruit next year. Keep your eyes on the SMASH Facebook page next September for when they are ready to be picked – they belong to the community!

Community composting: Emma Gray has been busy coordinating this side of our work which you will have seen posters for no doubt. The site will hopefully be in Galmpton. She has put in a lot of work and effort on this. Thanks.

New hedgerow at the Village Hall Car Park: Scarlett has been busy researching funds for this project to continue the hedge along the Salcombe Road bank. We have 420 whips to go in in March. The bank will be cleared and covered in a weed suppressant and planted through the material to prevent it being overgrown by the powerful

We have much to thank God for, especially the brightening of the weather now that the anticyclonic gloom is drifting away. 

National Trust South Hams Centre

Since 1980 the South Hams Centre has raised over £225,000 to support work on local NT coastline, woodland and farmland, as well as nearby properties. Whilst Overbeck's is the closest, we have also donated funds to Coleton Fishacre and Greenway. Over the Christmas period this year both these houses will be trimmed in traditional decorations and special festive events have been arranged.

At Greenway there will be a Christmas wreath trail around the garden. Each wreath is inspired by a favourite Christmas song – from number one hits to favourite radio classics for visitors to guess the title and sing the answer out loud! The wreaths have been hand created and decorated by Greenway's staff, volunteers and supporters, including the local primary school and a few artistic members of this supporter group.

At Coleton Fishacre visitors will be invited to step inside the house and imagine Christmas as it would have been in the 1920s. Elegant rooms lit by the twinkle of lights and sumptuously decorated trees, swags of greenery plucked from the garden adorn mantelpieces and window sills, and timeless classics played on the piano in the saloon. You can also peek in the Servants' Hall. We very much look forward to seeing all this when we have our coach trip there on 19th December.

It is always advisable to check the websites, but both properties should be open from 11:00 to 16:00 at the weekends in December on 1st, 7th and 8th and 14th and 15th. At Coleton Fishacre, later dates are 18th to 24th December and 27th December to 1st January. Greenway will open 21st, 22nd December and 27th to 31st

The tenant has been carrying out lots of stock fencing work at East Soar Farm to protect the new hedgebanks which are being planted up with hardy hedging plants at the moment. Kingsbridge Community College students are going to be helping with the hedgerow planting through December so we hope the weather will be kind to them!

The fencing has also been completed to separate out the new path which runs in the field parallel to the track from the NT car park to East Soar Outdoor Experience. We still have some work to complete here – grass seeding it and installing some pedestrian gates. We look forward to opening it in the New Year. This will offer an alternative route away from the farm traffic and also hopefully will avoid the dust clouds in the summer to make this section a much more pleasant experience to walk.

A wooden aeroplane bench is being made which will be a



National Trust model of a Supermarine Spitfire; we have been advised that many of these planes flew from Bolt Head in the Second World War. Alongside the current information panel in the car park, this will be a reminder to visitors of the important history of this site and the part it played in the war.

Thanks to funding from the South Devon National Landscapes team we are also installing an interpretive wooden bench at Southdown Farm overlooking the new ponds which will have images of the farm etched into it. We hope this will be installed during December.

We have had another really good year for the farmland birds around the Bolt Head to Bolt Tail area due to the careful management of the wildflower rich grasslands. The farms leave lots of winter stubbles and arable plants for the birds to feed on so they are in good condition coming into the spring breeding season.

Breeding pairs of Cirl Bunting were at a steady 35 pairs in 2019 and this year Rob Macklin our fantastic volunteer bird surveyor recorded 80! Skylarks have also been doing well with 210 breeding pairs in 2019 and 330 this year. These species are really struggling nationally – they have always done well on the mixed farms in South Devon. We probably all take for granted hearing skylark singing on our

walks – it is really rewarding to see they are responding so positively to an increased provision of food for them along with good nesting areas.

A Farming in the Protected Lanscape grant (FiPL) for access improvements is funding the resurfacing of some sections of the Bolberry Down access path. This has also been supported by a private donation for which we are very grateful. This is also funding 'trombone handles' on pedestrian gates at Snapes Point and Little Dartmouth which are easier to use for people with limited mobility. We will be looking at improving the Access for All path at Snapes Point next year as it is currently not fit for purpose.

Ranger work this winter

The ranger team are back onto the winter work programme, carrying out scrub clearance to remove pinch points where cattle and visitors need more space to move around each other on the footpaths. They are also hedgelaying and carrying out footpath repairs and replacing broken signage. As always they are supported by our fantastic team of volunteers who brave the winter weather to help keep the sites well cared for.






